Case C-358/89 Extramet Industrie SA v Council of the European Communities [1991] ECR I-2501

Facts: The applicant was the biggest importer of calcium metal into the EU, and sought to annul a Council regulation which imposed anti-dumping duties on such imports.

Held: The Court referred to Case 25/62 *Plaumann v. Commission* [1963] ECR 95 and determined that the applicant was individual concerned as it could prove the existence of certain attributes which were peculiar to it and which differentiated it from all other traders: not only was the applicant the biggest importer of the product subject to the anti-dumping measure, but its business relied largely on those imports, and it stood to be seriously affected by the regulation.
